Supported a supervised Java development practicum focused on a Core Java reservation service, relational data access, testing, documentation, and collaborative release practices. Translated faculty needs into working software while building practical habits for client project delivery.

- Built a **Core Java** equipment reservation service with encapsulation, interfaces, collections, and exception handling across a 12-feature backlog.
- Converted faculty requirements into user stories, class diagrams, and implementation tasks, giving weekly demonstrations a traceable delivery path.
- Added input validation and JUnit tests for reservation conflicts, date handling, and invalid records, then fixed defects found during instructor review.
- Connected application workflows with PostgreSQL through JDBC and documented schema decisions, query behavior, and setup steps for repeatable execution.
- Used Git feature branches and pull-request code reviews among three students, applying feedback before each graded release.
- Presented a working prototype and troubleshooting guide to 20 classmates, earning high distinction for reliability and technical documentation.

- Delivered a supervised **Java** capstone application that connected student interests with volunteer opportunities. Owned feature implementation, test coverage, defect analysis, documentation, and team coordination, creating a practical setting for software programming growth.
- Developed a Java REST-style application with search, filtering, registration, and profile features, giving reviewers a complete service workflow for demonstration.
 - Applied object-oriented design and reusable service classes to separate business rules from persistence and request handling, making changes easier to test.
 - Implemented **C++** comparisons for sorting and lookup strategies, using runtime observations and test cases to support algorithm decisions in a final report.
 - Created unit and integration tests for incomplete profiles, duplicate registrations, and unavailable opportunities before each sprint review.
 - Diagnosed defects through structured logs and debugger sessions, then recorded root causes and corrective actions in a shared issue tracker.
 - Coordinated requirement walkthroughs and sprint presentations with four classmates, producing an installation guide and runnable repository for faculty review.

Completed a supervised object-oriented programming project for a simulated community bookstore. Built foundational Java and Core Java skills through domain modeling, persistence, testing, C++ comparisons, peer review, and live demonstrations.

- Designed a **Core Java** inventory application modeling books, orders, customers, and stock movements with inheritance and interfaces for maintainable domain behavior.
- Implemented menu-driven workflows, file-based persistence, and defensive error handling, preserving records after malformed quantities or identifiers.
- Wrote JUnit tests for pricing rules, inventory updates, and order cancellation, using boundary cases before final classroom submission.
- Compared Java and C++ implementations of linked lists, stacks, and maps, documenting memory and usability tradeoffs in a technical reflection.
- Used Git for incremental commits and reviewed peer code for naming, duplication, and maintainability during scheduled lab sessions.
- Demonstrated application behavior to an instructor and 15 classmates, responded to live test scenarios, and revised documentation from evaluation feedback.
