Dear Hiring Manager,

I am applying for the Junior .NET Developer position at Northstar Claims Technologies. I have three years of experience building and supporting healthcare software with C#, .NET, ASP.NET Core, MVC, Web API, SQL Server, Oracle, and VB.NET. My recent work has focused on claims and revenue cycle workflows, so I understand the importance of reliable processing, traceable data, and fixes that do not create new problems downstream.

In my current role, I develop .NET microservices for claim intake, status updates, and exception routing. I have added API and MVC features, designed SQL Server changes for claim and remittance workflows, and maintained event-driven messaging between claims services and payer integrations. When a production message fails, I use correlation IDs, representative records, and replay procedures to find the cause; I then add regression coverage and document the fix for support and quality teams. I also package services for Kubernetes deployments with health checks and rollback notes.

Earlier, I built ASP.NET MVC and Web API features and converted selected VB.NET utilities into C# services without losing the underlying business rules. That work included querying both Oracle and SQL Server for reconciliation screens, debugging request and database traces, and adding unit and integration tests before shared QA. I am comfortable working under senior developer guidance, contributing to code reviews, and explaining technical issues clearly to both engineering and revenue cycle stakeholders.

I would bring practical healthcare software experience, a careful approach to data and messaging, and a willingness to learn from the engineers and architects responsible for your platform. I would welcome the opportunity to discuss how I could contribute to Northstar Claims Technologies.
