Current BLS certification supports bedside transition, with NCLEX preparation and plans for **Michigan RN licensure**, NIHSS, and AHA ACLS within required onboarding timelines. 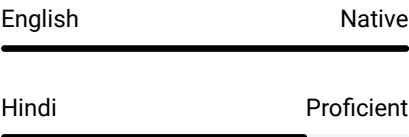
